Thought for Today for the reading set for today

(please note the 9.30am Parish Communion readings are different)

This morning at 8 o'clock, Holy Communion Service we have the well-known creation story from Genesis as our Old Testament reading. This wasn't meant as a historical account but as a reflection on the meaning of creation and humanity's place in it according to God's purpose. There are several significant repetitions in the story which strike us:

- God says of each thing created "let there be" which suggest the desire that every part of creation should be free to fulfil what it was meant to be in its unique identity
- After each act of creation God saw that it was good or very good

This suggests the duty we should recognise to respect every aspect of creation and although human beings are set above creation we are facing the consequences today of having taken our role in "dominating" creation as a licence to exploit it for our own ends. We are at last beginning to recognise the need to change our ways before it is too late to protect the earth from irreversible harm.

Lent

This year Lent begins on the Wednesday the 22nd of February, Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday on the 2nd of April and Easter Sunday falls on the 9th of April.

It is traditional to take up some form of self-denial or fast, to replicate the temptations Jesus faced in the wilderness before beginning his ministry, to spend time contemplating our own mistakes, shortcomings, brokenness and need for the forgiveness and love of God.

It is also common to take up extra reading, good works or spiritual disciplines. Ultimately, it is a time to prepare ourselves for Easter.

There are many opportunities to engage in this season ahead of us at All Saints and a leaflet is now available. For example, the Lent Groups are a great way to engage a bit more deeply with Lent. Do explore which groups are running, the times and venues. We hope to publish these soon. It is really worthwhile using this season to put time, thought and prayer into our faith. Lent groups are also a good way to get to know other people from All Saints in a different way. Another idea is to come to the church on a Tuesday morning from 9.45 to 10.15am for peaceful reflection. There is a service of Holy Communion at 10.15am.

This year's Lent course takes as its starting point Rembrandt's painting 'The Return of the Prodigal Son'. Drawing on the work of the 20th-century priest, writer and theologian Henri Nouwen, we will explore the painting, and the Biblical story it is based on, in five sessions: 'The younger son leaves home'; 'The younger son returns'; 'The elder son'; 'The father'; 'Living the painting'. As we study this parable, we are invited to see aspects of our own stories reflected in each of its characters, and learn to love as the father and be loved as the son. Venues and days and times of meetings are on the sheet at the back of Church. If you would like to join a group, please write your name on the sheet at the back of church.

Mission of the Month for February: Tyneside Welcome, a local charity run by a small group of volunteers on Tyneside with no single political or faith-based affiliation. Their aim is to take on the responsibility for resettling Syrian refugee families on Tyneside through a Government approved Community Sponsorship scheme.
