Thought for Today

The Transfiguration of our Lord is a great story in the Gospels, an episode where Jesus is revealed as he truly is, not merely as a special man, or a marvellous teacher, but as the Son of God. It came at a particularly significant time for the disciples. Before they face difficulties, they gain insight into how things are going to be. The disciples are shown that the divine hand is at work in the events, that Jesus will endure and that there will be glory in the end.

The Transfiguration then, was a marvellous experience for those closest of Jesus' disciples, one which they wanted to last for ever. This is why Peter makes that rather embarrassing comment about making three tents for Moses, Elijah and Jesus. This is because, by the rules of Middle-Eastern hospitality, to set up somewhere for them to stay would require them to remain until the host wished them to leave.

I think this story helps us on the journey we are about to make during the season of Lent. It is not going to be easy, but we see we are part of a greater reality, and despite how it seems, how badly life goes wrong and the unexpected happens, there will be a glorious ending.

Today at the Parish Communion - Andrew Cole will give an update on 'Tyneside Welcomes' and its hope to house and support a refugee family.

The Grapes of Wrath is a 1940 American film directed by John Ford. It was based on John Steinbeck's 1939 Pulitzer Prize-winning novel of the same name. The film tells the story of the Joads, an Oklahoma family, who, after losing their farm during the Great Depression in the 1930s, become migrant workers and end up in California. The motion picture details their arduous journey across the United States as they travel to California in search of work and opportunities for the family members. The film is widely considered to be one of the greatest films of all time. In 1989, it was one of the first 25 films selected by the Library of Congress for preservation in the United States National Film Registry for being "culturally, historically, or aesthetically significant".

ALL SAINTS CHURCH GOSFORTH: AMNESTY GROUP LETTER FEBRUARY 2023

Luis Manuel Otero Alcantara is a black Cuban artist who loves to paint, dance and wear bright colours. His home in San Isidro in Havana was an open house for people to meet. When the government issued Decree 349, a law seeking to silence critical artists and others, Luis Manuel became a leader of the San Isidro Movement, formed to oppose this. He posted a video online saying that he intended to join a large demonstration against government censorship. Before this demonstration took place, Luis Manuel was arrested and, following a trial behind closed doors, he was sentenced to five years' imprisonment. He is held in Guanajay maximum security prison.


I am writing to you about Luis Manuel Otero Alcantara who posted a video online on 11th July 2021 to say that he intended to join a protest against government censorship. He was the leader of the San Isidro Movement, a diverse group of artists, journalists and activists who wish to defend the right to freedom of expression and protest against Decree 349, a law which seeks to silence critical artists.

Luis Manuel was arrested before the protest took place and sentenced to five years' imprisonment in a trial which took place behind closed doors. He is now being held in Guanajay maximum security prison.

I urge you to release Luis Manuel Otero Alcantara immediately and unconditionally, as he has been detained solely for exercising his rights to freedom of expression and peaceful protest.
