Thought for Today

Today, the day of Pentecost or Whit Sunday, is the one of the most important of all church festivals. It is the birthday of the church, the day that church came into being with the receiving of wonderful gifts.

In the reading we hear again that the disciples were gathered in one place and how with a rush of wind, tongues of fire rested upon them. They then went out fearlessly to preach the Good news to the world. They could not have done this if they had not received 'power from on high'

Pentecost is a celebration of a turning point in history- it was a second creation. The message of Pentecost is that God calls and equips us, as transformed people and we are to play our part in his ongoing mission. At the 9.30 Service, before the dismissal during the hymn, we will light candles to represent our participation in this mission.

At the **Diocesan Synod on 13th May** Bishop Helen Ann spoke of a vision for turning outwards in mission and ministry and the church becoming younger and more diverse. This being characterised by:

SHARING through being generous with God's transforming gifts in our **hospitality**;
SENDING through being engaged in God's transforming work in the world in our **service**.

She spoke of the values of **seeking**, **sharing**, and **sending** as being enabled by intentional resourcing, attentiveness to our diverse contexts, and effective partnerships with no silos.

Over the next 6 months we will consider practical ways to promote this vision.

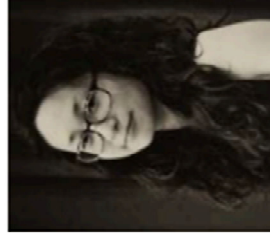
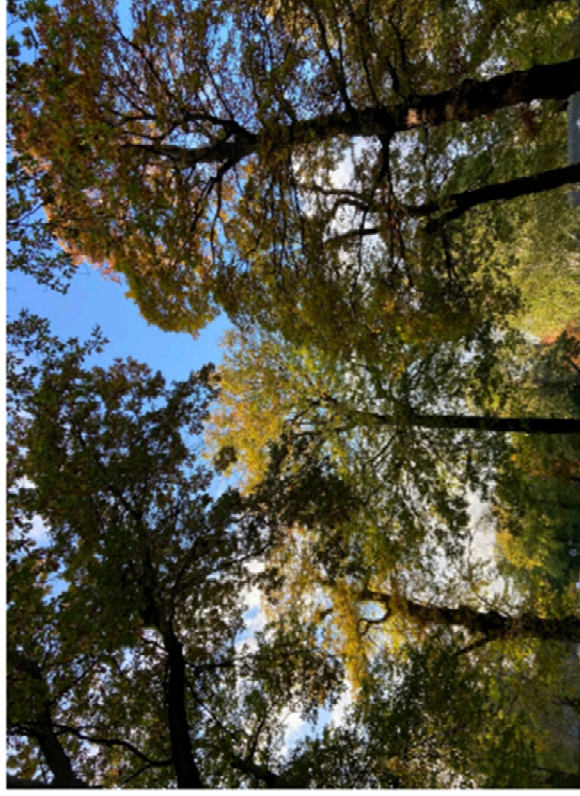
This 2020 comedy drama tells how in 1961 60-year-old Newcastle man Kempton Bunton stole Goya's portrait of the Duke of Wellington from the National Gallery in London. He sent ransom notes saying he would return the picture – still in its frame – on condition that the Government invested more in the care of the elderly, in particular by waiving the TV licence for pensioners.

A few years ago, Bunton's grandson approached filmmakers with this uplifting story of how a basically good man went to remarkable lengths for a cause he felt so strongly about.
