### Thought for Today

Today's gospel reading is among the most well known passages in the whole of the Bible. In it, Jesus is confronted with a question: which of the commandments of the Law is the most important? The question is designed to test Jesus and possibly even trip him up. But it also reflects an understanding that in the real world sometimes there is no perfect option, and we must choose between a range of less-than-perfect actions. What then? How do we prioritise, how do we discern what is the greater and what the lesser evil? Jesus's answer astonished his questioners and has become famous ever since: the greatest commandment is love. Rather than focus on specific actions, Jesus identifies motive as the heart of the Law. The law is meant to cultivate love, to form hearts and minds that seek the glory of God and the good of others. St Augustine would later say: Love, and do what you will. Because when we truly love God and our neighbours, our desires are directed rightly. We may still face impossible decisions, and we may still fall short - of our own ideals. But if we take love as our compass, we will be heading in the right direction.

### ALL SAINTS CHURCH GOSFORTH: AMNESTY GROUP LETTER OCTOBER 2023

Dr Mohammed al-Roken is a Human Rights lawyer who is among eight Emirati citizens who are still in prison despite having completed their sentences. It was in July 2013 that he was convicted of attempting to overthrow the government and given a 10-year sentence following a mass trial of activitists and critics of the authorities. The politically motivated trial – known as 'UAE-94 – was part of a major crackdown designed to silence calls for reform. The proceedings were grossly unfair and marred by abuses, including defendants being denied access to a lawyer and held incommunicado or in solitary confinement. 'Confessions' obtained through torture were also used in court as evidence of their guilt. Amnesty considers Dr al-Roken and the seven other dissidents to be prisoners of conscience.

### Dr Mohammed al-Roken

I am writing to you to express my concern at the fact that Dr Mohammed al-Roken, a human rights lawyer and academic, is still being kept in prison despite completing the 10-year sentence which he was given in July 2013 on the grounds of attempting to overthrow the government.

Internationally he is regarded as a prisoner of conscience and indeed should never have been convicted originally if his 'confession' had not been obtained through torture and he had been allowed his own legal representation.

I respectfully urge you to order his immediate and unconditional release, along with that of the seven other Emiratis whom I understand have been treated similarly.
