### Thought for Today

In today's Gospel reading the Greeks came to Philip and asked to see Jesus. It would be interesting to know what they expected to see. Would it be the Messiah victorious over the country's enemies as the Jews expected or would it be a teacher of philosophical ideals in the Greek tradition?

Whatever was expected, their request points to the appeal of Jesus beyond national and ethnic boundaries. Jesus cannot be confined to any one tradition as is evident in the fact that many religions see Jesus as one of their prophets.

Jesus, however, goes beyond what anyone expected by going to his crucifixion to demonstrate the power of sacrificial love and calls on his disciples to demonstrate the same willingness to deny themselves in the service of what they are called to as his followers.

### The Owl and the Nightingale- Translated by Simon Armitage

Following his acclaimed translation of <u>Sir Gawain and the Green Knight</u>, Simon Armitage shines light on another jewel of Middle English verse. In his highly engaging version, Armitage communicates the energy and humour of the tale with all the cut and thrust of the original.

An unnamed narrator overhears a fierce verbal contest between the two birds, which moves entertainingly from the eloquent and philosophical to the ribald and ridiculous. The disputed issues still resonate - concerning identity, cultural habits, class distinctions and the right to be heard.
