### **Thought for Today**

Being a shepherd was a low grade job in New Testament times. It involved overnight work, sitting in the hills and sometimes being cold and lonely. Shepherds lived on the margins of Jewish society and were thought to be rough and unclean. Yet, at the same time, the image of God as shepherd is used several times in the Old Testament. Among the reasons that the image of good shepherd is used is the belief that good leaders are more concerned with protection of those in their trust than with self-protection. The hired hand neither has investment in the sheep nor cares for them but Jesus lays down his life for the sheep when the wolf comes. The 'good shepherd' emerged as an early symbol of Jesus, embodying qualities such as guidance, protection, nurturing, and authenticity

### ALL SAINTS CHURCH GOSFORTH: AMNESTY GROUP LETTER APRIL 2024

Umar Khalid Is a Muslim human-rights defender and scholar who was active in protesting against the Citizenship (Amendment) Act, a law which legitimises discrimination on the basis of religion and which violates both the Indian constitution and international human rights law. He has attended demonstrations and has made speeches against this legislation. He was arrested on 13<sup>th</sup> September 2020 after being accused of communal violence and was charged under multiple provisions of the Indian Penal Code and the draconian Unlawful (Activities) Prevention Act. He has been held in prison for three years without trial and his bail applications have been repeatedly rejected by the courts. Umar has been imprisoned solely for peacefully exercising his rights to freedom of expression and assembly.

### **Umar Khalid**

I am writing to express my concern at the imprisonment of Umar Khalid, a Muslim human rights defender and scholar who protested peacefully and made speeches against the Citizenship (Amendment) Act, a law which legitimises discrimination on the basis of religion and which violates both the Indian constitution and international human rights law.

Umar was arrested on 13<sup>th</sup> September 2020 after being accused of inciting communal violence and charged under provisions of the Indian Penal Code and the Unlawful (Activities) Prevention Act. He has been held for over three years without trial and his bail applications have been repeatedly rejected by the courts.

This man has been imprisoned solely for peacefully exercising his rights to freedom of expression and assembly. I urge you to ensure that he is released immediately and unconditionally.
