Thought for Today

I have never been in a small boat on a rough sea, so can only imagine what it must have felt like for the disciples, caught in a storm as they made their way across the Sea of Galilee. Perhaps something like turbulence in an airplane combined with being caught outside in a thunderstorm: all the discomfort of violent motion and all the vulnerability of exposure to the elements. To make matters worse, Jesus is literally asleep on the job, doing nothing to help. What happens next, though, reveals something important about who Jesus is. Jesus wakes up and immediately demonstrates his power and authority over creation by commanding the wind and the waves to be calm. The disciples are in awe, and left wondering: who is this? Mark's invitation to us as his readers is to ask ourselves that question, too. Who is Jesus? And can we trust him in our storms?

The next Film Night, on Friday 28th June, will show the DVD of Lost in Translation. Sofia Coppola, the American daughter of famous movie directors, wanted to write and direct this story after spending time in Tokyo in her youth. The film was low budget and she had to take a risk making it because actor Bill Murray would not commit until after shooting was underway. It was a box office success and eventually won awards, but it has been criticised for making fun of Japanese people. It describes the cultural differences between Japan and the USA by imagining two people, who are accommodated in the same hotel, both suffering from jet lag and both having to fill in some time in this huge and very foreign, but very modern city. They slowly get to know each other but are not tempted to consummate the relationship until too late. Both Ruth Birnie and I recall difficulties in understanding it first time around. A little homework on Safari or google might make it easier. It is easy to approach this film as a comparison of what can be difficulties in the early years of a marriage to that of later mid-life crises, but in fact it is an excellent "Rom Com", as well as a study of modern life just before the social media era took over.

ALL SAINTS CHURCH GOSFORTH: AMNESTY GROUP LETTER JUNE 2024

On 8 January 2024 Manahel al-Otaibi, a 29-year-old fitness instructor and women's rights activist, was sentenced in a secret trial by Saudi Arabia's Specialised Criminal Court to 11 years in prison for 'terrorist offences'. She had been detained on 16 November 2022 and charged with violating the Anti-Cyber Crime Law for tweeting in support of women's rights and posting pictures of herself wearing 'immodest clothing' in a mall, i.e. without an abaya which is a traditional loose-fitting long-sleeved robe. Manahel was forcibly disappeared by the authorities between 5 November 2023 and 14 April 2024, when she was allowed a brief phone call to her family: she was being held in solitary confinement in al-Malaz Prison with a broken leg after being brutally beaten by an unidentified person and with no access to medical care.

Your Excellency

Manahel al-Otaibi

I am distressed to learn that on 8 January 2024 Manahel al-Otaibi, a 29-year-old fitness instructor and women's rights activist, was sentenced to 11 years in prison for 'terrorist offences' by Saudi Arabia's Specialised Criminal Court in a secret trial.

Manahel had been detained on 16 November 2022 and charged with violating the Anti-Cyber Crime Law for tweeting in support of women's rights and posting pictures of herself without an abaya.

After more than five months of enforced disappearance between 5 November 2023 and 14 April 2024, Manahel called her family to let them know that she is being held in solitary confinement in al-Malaz prison with a broken leg after being brutally beaten by either a guard or a fellow prisoner and without access to medical care.

I urge you to order the immediate and unconditional release of Manahel al-Otaibi as she has been convicted solely for peacefully exercising her right to freedom of expression. Pending her release, please grant her immediate access to medical care and order an impartial investigation into her allegations of torture and other ill-treatment.


