Thought for Today

The passage from Philippians 4:4-7, which serves as our Epistle for today, was also chosen by Margaret Wilkinson to be read at her memorial service.

In this passage, Paul calls for constant joy in the Lord—a joy that is not dependent on changing circumstances but rooted in confidence in God's sovereignty and goodness. He encourages us to demonstrate gentleness and patience toward one another, even in times of stress. Paul also urges us to let go of anxiety and not be consumed by worry. Instead, he points us toward a profound peace that surpasses human understanding—a peace that comes from an experience of the Lord that can be found in reading the Bible, receiving the sacrament, and listening to Him in prayer.

Happiness or stability dependent on external factors is fragile. Those who inspire us so often have known an inner source that has kept them going. We give thanks for them and seek to dare to be open to that divine grace which changes everything.
