Thought for Today

Low Sunday

The only thing that's "low" about today is that it's the lesser of the two Sundays in the Easter octave. Every day of the first week of Eastertide is a mini-Easter-Day. But there are two Sundays, so the second is designated "low" Sunday to distinguish it from the first. But cue lots of sermons about the "low" after the "high." Of course "highs" and "lows" can be like that, especially the sort that are artificially induced - like when a hangover follows a merry night before. But the mystery of Easter should not be like this. Yes, the individual Christian life has lows and highs, and the lows can be essential to growth. But in the great schema of the Christian year, the big picture is this: We are just at the beginning of seven weeks (a week of weeks) of unfolding mystery! That's why, at the same time as hearing Gospels which tell of the resurrection, we are also hearing weekly from the Acts of the Apostles - in which the first witnesses of the Resurrection are transformed from dull, uncomprehending Disciples into inspired and inspiring Apostles. For proof that this continues to happen in our day, look no further than the story of the late Pope Francis: humble, humane, self-giving, a servant leader perfect in his imperfections. Able to inhabit with integrity the territory where living tradition is in dialogue with lived experience. May those responsible for choosing his successor, and those responsible for finding us a new Primate of All England, keep such an Apostolic example before them!
