Thought for this week

"Pray as you can, not as you can't." That is sound advice and reassuring to those who find that ways of prayer they have been taught are now difficult or have ceased to be meaningful. Jesus in today's Gospel reading taught the disciples The Lord's Prayer which we now use in every service but prayer can take many forms, not all of them using words.

Many people find the silence of meditation just what they need while for others finding a suitable place and time might be difficult but prayer can happen at any time and in any place. God is present everywhere if only we take the trouble to be aware of his presence. I find the words of the 17th century monk Brother Lawrence in his book *The Practice of the Presence of God* very encouraging. He writes:

"The time of business does not with me differ from the time of prayer; and in the noise and clatter of my kitchen, while several persons are at the same time calling for different things, I possess God in as great tranquillity as if I were upon my knees at the blessed sacrament."

That is in keeping with the Benedictine teaching that "laborare est orare", to work is to pray and encourages us to see prayer not as something separate from the rest of our lives.

Lammas (from the Old English hlaf-mas, **meaning loaf mass)** is an ancient Christian festival celebrated on 1st August, marking the beginning of the cereal harvest. Once widespread across many communities it is now coming back into favour. Whilst Harvest Festivals celebrate the end of the season, Lammas honours the beginning - the 'first fruits'. This year at All Saints' we are recognising this tradition with special prayers, a small display of fruit and vegetables from local gardens and some freshly-baked bread.
