Thought for this week

In Luke 10, Jesus sends out seventy - or seventy-two - ordinary disciples, not experts, on a mission to every town and village. This is marked by urgency, vulnerability, and dependence on God. They are sent as lambs among wolves, bearing peace and announcing the nearness of God's Kingdom - a Kingdom not just promised, but present. Their instructions are stark and demanding, yet they return with joy, having witnessed healing, hospitality, and victory over evil.

Jesus reminds them - and us - that true identity lies not in success, but in being known and loved by God. In our mission to live out the Christian life, we are called to trust, to go out faithfully, and to share peace, even in the face of rejection, knowing that God's Kingdom strangely breaks into the world through our sincerity.

Prayer Walk In Gosforth, just three miles from the city centre, we enjoy green spaces, tree-lined streets, and diverse birdlife due to the large gardens. Other wildlife can be seen from time to time – hedgehogs and urban foxes come out after dusk – and even wild flowers flourish at the sides of the roads and poke their heads out between the paving cracks. We see bees, butterflies and other pollinating insects, and this cycle of life means that over the year there is always something to see – the freshness of spring, the lush greens of summer, the rich colours of autumn and the stark beauty of bare shapes throughout winter. In all of this we are truly blessed.

This year we are planning a Prayer Walk on **Sunday 3rd August**, starting from All Saints and wandering up through Elgy Green, over to the Ashburton cemetery and back along to Elmfield Road, Linden Road and to the Centre, stopping at three or four points for a short prayer and reflection, thanking God for the gifts he has given us. We will end the afternoon with tea, cake and fellowship.

The walk will begin at 2.00 pm and take around an hour. It will be suitable for all ages (young children will be given a special 'quiz sheet') and will be pushchair/wheelchair-friendly, but if anyone does find it a little too far there are numerous short-cuts back to All Saints.


