Thought for the Week

When Jesus returned to His hometown of Nazareth, He was met not with faith but with disbelief. Those who had known Him as a boy could not see beyond the familiar to recognise the divine before them. The people's scepticism reminds us how easily our assumptions can blind us to the presence of God and to His work in those we think we already know.

Reflecting on this, I think of my own journey in ministry - beginning more than forty years ago, serving close to where I grew up in Bristol. I found that familiarity can make ministry difficult. Yet, in those early years and later in parish life, I learned that God's grace is most often revealed in ordinary people and everyday places - in homes, workplaces, and communities where kindness, endurance, and quiet service shine through.

The heart of the Gospel, and one lesson I have learned is that God is deeply involved in the ordinary. He meets us not just in great spiritual experiences but in the rough and real texture of daily life - our joys, struggles, and relationships. He calls us to faithfulness in the world as it is, to look for Him in unexpected places, and to trust that the Holy Spirit is at work even where we least expect Him.
