This morning we welcome Mark, Bishop of Berwick and our candidate Nancy Louise McCabe

A warm welcome to you all, to those who have travelled to be with us this morning, to those worshipping God in this place for the first time and to Bishop Mark Wroe who will confirm the candidate and preside at our celebration of Holy Communion..

The Sermon

LITURGY OF INITIATION

The candidate for confirmation is presented.

Have you been baptised in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit?

I have.

Are you ready with your own mouth and from your own heart to affirm your faith in Jesus Christ?

I am.

The Bishop addresses the whole congregation:

People of God, will you welcome Nancy and uphold her in her life in Christ?

With the help of God, we will.

The Profession of Faith

The Bishop addresses the congregation:

Brothers and sisters, I ask you to profess, together with this candidate, the faith of the Church.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father? I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ?

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,

who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit? I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

The Confirmation

The Bishop stands before Nancy who is to be confirmed, and says:

Our help is in the name of the Lord who has made heaven and earth.



Blessed be the name of the Lord now and for ever. Amen.

The Bishop extends his hands towards the candidate to be confirmed and says:

Almighty and ever-living God, you have given your servant new birth in baptism by water and the Spirit, and have forgiven her sins.

Let your Holy Spirit rest upon her: the Spirit of wisdom and understanding; the Spirit of counsel and inward strength; the Spirit of knowledge and true godliness; and let her delight be in the fear of the Lord.

Amen.

The Bishop addresses the candidate by name.

Nancy, God has called you by name and made you his own.

He then lays his hand on her head, saying:

Confirm, O Lord, your servant Nancy with your Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The Bishop invites the congregation to pray

Defend, O Lord, this your servant with your heavenly grace, that she may continue yours for ever, and daily increase in your Holy Spirit more and more until she comes to your everlasting kingdom. Amen.

Welcome and Peace

The confirmed stands with the Bishop at the chancel step. The Bishop says:

There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism. By one Spirit we are all baptized into one body. We welcome you into the fellowship of faith; we are children of the same heavenly Father; we welcome you.

The Bishop says:

God has made us one in Christ. He has set his seal upon us and, as a pledge of what is to come, has given the Spirit to dwell in our hearts.

The peace of the Lord be always with you. **And also with you.**

All exchange a sign of peace.

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you and also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

The Bishop praises God for his mighty acts, and all respond:

Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of
the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.

The prayer continues as the Bishop recalls the Last Supper.

Great is the mystery of faith: Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

The prayer continues and all join in the final **Amen.**

The Lord's Prayer

Let us pray with confidence as our Saviour has taught us.

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory for ever and ever. Amen.

Breaking of the Bread

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ. Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

Giving of Communion

Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word and I shall be healed.

Members of any Christian Church who normally receive communion are invited to receive at this service. Those who are not confirmed are welcome to come forward to receive a blessing – if you do so, please bring this service sheet in your hand. Please follow the direction of the stewards who will indicate when to move.

During the Communion, the choir sings an anthem.

THE SENDING OUT

The Blessing

The God of all grace, who called you to his eternal glory in Christ Jesus, establish, strengthen and settle you in the faith; and the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be upon you and remain with you always.

Amen.
