### Thought for the Day - Christ the King

Today in the readings we hold together two very different images of Jesus.

St Paul shows us Christ as the one in whom the fullness of God dwells - the centre of creation, the one who holds everything together. Yet the Gospel shows him humiliated on the cross, dying as a criminal.

This contrast is the heart of our faith: the maker of the stars and sea is the one who suffers for us. His crown is of thorns, his throne a cross. He is not a king who demands service, but a king who serves—a Servant King who gives everything for us.

So we ask: Who is really king in our lives? Who and what shapes our choices and gives us meaning?

When we pray, "Thy kingdom come," we ask that Jesus' way of justice, mercy, and hope take root in us even now. On this Stir-Up Sunday, we remind one another that welcoming Christ as our King brings not restriction but true freedom and life—for, in the words of the well-loved prayer, "his service is perfect freedom."

Talk on 'Living with Neurodivergence – how do we relate better?' 8th November 2025 We welcomed about 25 people to this talk in church from a broad range of social & professional backgrounds and as relevant for people already in church as those arriving from outside. Louise Keyes covered a lot of areas to consider to reduce areas that can be stressful for the 1 in 4 people who are neurodivergent – sitting still, staying quiet, difficulty switching tasks or attention, struggling with vocabulary and non-literal phrases, shutting out distractions such as flickering or excessive lighting, noise, conversation. For others the opposite of the above! We called a halt to conversations after 5pm – numerous folk had stayed on to exchange views and experiences. The most common response heard was of gratitude for holding the discussion – one individual was incredulous that our church had the thoughtfulness to invite this event. Five people asked if they could have the same talk delivered in their own parishes and areas.

### Mission of the Month for November

MACS also supports the Chilema Ecumenical Training Centre near Zomba which is where Felicity Shoesmith (from our own congregation) lived until she was 9 years of age. The centre was set up in the early 1960's and provides a six-month practical skills course for women. It was innovative for its time and is still inspiring today because, in a very traditional societal structure, it is encouraging women to learn basic skills that often act as a spring board into nursing, running their own business or being able to look after their families. During their visit to Malawi in August on behalf of MACS, Felicity and Helen Langley met women on the course sponsored by MACS. They also met Linda who had benefited from the skills she had learnt on the course by setting up her own tailoring business she now employs two young orphaned teenagers.




### This month's film is The Odd Couple
