


Parish Communion with Epiphany Procession

THE GATHERING

Hymn

O worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness! Bow down before him, his glory proclaim; with gold of obedience, and incense of lowliness, kneel and adore him, the Lord is his name!

Gloria in excelsis

We sing:

Glory to God in the highest. and peace to his people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

The Collect

Come and worship ...


Though an infant now we view him, he shall fill his Father's throne, gather all the nations to him; every knee shall then bow down:

The Sermon

All sit.

A short silence is kept at the end of the sermon.

The Creed

All stand.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.
For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.
On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Our Saviour Christ is the Prince of Peace. Of the increase of his government and of peace there shall be no end. The peace of the Lord be always with you and also with you.



The Epiphany Procession

Hymn

The first Nowell the Angel did say was to certain poor Shepherds in fields as they lay. In fields where they lay keeping their sheep, On a cold winter's night that was so deep.

Nowell, nowell, nowell.

Born is the King of Israel.

They looked up and saw a star shining in the East, beyond them far, and to the earth it gave great light, and so it continued, both day and night. Nowell, nowell, nowell Born is the King of Israel.

And by the light of that same Star three Wise Men came from country far, to seek for a King was their intent, and to follow the Star wheresoever it went. Nowell, nowell, nowell, nowell.

Born is the King of Israel.

This Star drew nigh to the North West; O'er Bethlehem it took its rest.
And there it did both stop and stay, right over the place where Jesus lay.

Then entered in those Wise Men three, full reverently upon their knee, and offered there, in his presence, both gold, and myrrh, and frankincense. Nowell, nowell, nowell, nowell.

In the procession, gifts are carried to represent the offerings of the wise men:

- for 'gold', the bread and wine of the Eucharist, symbolising our wealth, the fruits of the earth and the fruits of our work;
- incense, to symbolise our worship and prayer;
- and for 'myrrh' the oils of healing, to symbolise our sharing in the sufferings of Christ and of his world.

The gifts are presented at the altar before the final verse of the hymn:

At the offering of Gold

Blessed are you, Lord our God, King of the Universe: to you be praise and glory for ever!
As gold in the furnace is tried and purified seven times in the fire, so purify our hearts and minds that we may be a royal priesthood acceptable in the service of your kingdom.

Blessed be God for ever.

At the offering of Incense

Blessed are you, Lord our God, King of the Universe: to you be praise and glory for ever!
As our prayer rises up before you as incense, so may we be presented before you with penitent hearts and uplifted hands to offer ourselves in your priestly service.

Blessed be God for ever.

At the offering of Myrrh

Blessed are you, Lord our God, King of the Universe: to you be praise and glory for ever!
As you give medicine to heal our sickness and the leaves of the tree of life for the healing of the nations, so anoint us with your healing power that we may be the first-fruits of your new creation.

Blessed be God for ever.



The final verse of the hymn is sung.

Then let us all with one accord sing praises to our heavenly Lord; that hath made heaven and earth of naught, and with his blood mankind hath bought.

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you and also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

Father, we give you thanks and praise through your beloved Son Jesus Christ, your living Word, through whom you have created all things; who was sent by you in your great goodness to be our Saviour.

By the power of the Holy Spirit he took flesh; as your Son, born of the blessed Virgin, he lived on earth and went about among us; he opened wide his arms for us on the cross; he put an end to death by dying for us; and revealed the resurrection by rising to new life; so he fulfilled your will and won for you a holy people.

And now we give you thanks because, in the incarnation of the Word, a new light has dawned upon the world, that all the nations may be brought out of darkness to see the radiance of your glory.

Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we proclaim your great and glorious name, for ever praising you and singing:

Holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Lord, you are holy indeed, the source of all holiness; grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit, and according to your holy will, these gifts of bread and wine may be to us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ;

who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.



In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying:
Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Praise to you, Lord Jesus

Dying you destroyed our death,
rising you restored our life:
Lord Jesus, come in glory.

And so, Father, calling to mind his death on the cross, his perfect sacrifice made once for the sins of the whole world; rejoicing in his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate this memorial of our redemption.

As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, we bring before you this bread and this cup

and we thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you. Send the Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your kingdom all who share this one bread and one cup, so that we, in the company of [N and] all the saints, may praise and glorify you for ever, through Jesus Christ our Lord;

by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.

Amen.

All kneel.

Believing the promises of God, let us pray with confidence as our Saviour has taught us.

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.

For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory for ever and ever.

Breaking of the Bread

The president breaks the consecrated bread.

We break the bread of life, and that life is the light of the world.

God here among us, light in the midst of us, bring us to light and life.

As the bread is broken, we sing:

Jesus, Lamb of God; have mercy on us.

Jesus, bearer of our sins; have mercy on us.

Jesus, redeemer of the world;

grant us peace.

The president breaks the consecrated bread.

Giving of Communion

Before the distribution the president says:

God's holy gifts for God's holy people. Jesus Christ is holy, Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.



Please come to Communion as directed by the stewards. Those who are communicant members of other Christian churches are welcome to share in the sacrament of Holy Communion with us. Those adults and children who are not ready to receive communion are invited to come to receive a blessing. It helps us to identify those who are not receiving Holy Communion if you bring this service sheet in your hand.

During the Communion, the choir sing the anthem "As With Gladness, Men of Old" by John Lewis and then we all sing:
