Thought for the Day

Gaudete!

Rejoice! It's the third Sunday of Advent (pink candle day) when we focus on the one who personifies Advent: Jesus's cousin John. In today's Gospel, Jesus observes that whilst John is among the greatest of the human race, "the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he." (Matthew 11.12) What can this mean? It sounds like Jesus is looking forward to the glory of heaven, which (through Christ) is the destiny of saints on earth. But that's a bit out of place at this point. Upon examination, there's another way of hearing these words: "the lesser in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he." The context is that of tension and uncertainty about who Jesus and John actually are, in God's purposes and in relation to each other. John is in prison, and Jesus is doing nothing about it. He seems more interested in the village life of Galilee than in speaking truth to power in Jerusalem, never mind challenging Roman oppression. John challenges Jesus, "Are you the one we're waiting for, or shall we look for another?" Jesus responds (in the interpretation suggested here) "The lesser is greater," i.e. I may be your junior in age (by 6 months), and not such an impressive wilderness prophet, but with God, less is more! The junior is ahead of the elder (remember Ishmael and Isaac, Esau and Jacob, Joseph and his brothers), and remember "the first shall be last and the last first" (Mt 19.20 and 29.16), not to mention the Beatitudes ("blessed are the poor in spirit, the sorrowful, the meek ...") and the Magnificat ("he has put down the mighty ...") Here is much food for thought about the Kingdom, the mission of God and the Church. Does "small is beautiful" get us off the hook of doing anything about our world of injustice? Quite the reverse. It means that the small things that little (powerless?) people do are crucial to the movement of God's Kingdom. Whilst the privileged are also called to give their all - great John and Jesus the Messiah were both obedient to the call to sacrificial service. Advent calls rich and poor, high and lowly, educated and uneducated, young and old, to rejoice together in the reality of God's Kingdom!
