### ***Greeting***

Hosanna to the Son of David!  
**Blessed is he who comes in  
the name of the Lord.**

Grace mercy and peace from  
God our Father  
and the Lord Jesus Christ be  
with you  
**and also with you.**

*The president introduces the  
celebration.*

*Everyone holds up their palm crosses  
or branches, while a prayer is said.*

### ***Palm Gospel***

*The story from Matthew 26:14 – 27 to  
end*

This is the Gospel of Christ  
**All praise to Christ our Lord.**  
***The Procession***

Let us go forth, praising Jesus  
our Messiah!

**Thanks be to God.**

*We start to sing the following song, as  
all leave the Centre and gather on the  
pavement outside, waiting until  
everyone has left the building before  
the procession sets off. During the  
procession to the church we continue  
to sing the song, repeating as  
necessary until everyone is inside the  
church*

**You are the King of Glory,  
you are the Prince of Peace,  
you are the Lord of heav'n and  
earth,  
you're the Son of  
righteousness.  
Angels bow down before you,  
worship and adore,  
for you have the words  
of eternal life,  
you are Jesus Christ the Lord.**

**Hosanna to the Son of David!  
Hosanna to the King of kings!  
Glory in the highest heaven,  
for Jesus the Messiah reigns!**

*On entering the church, the  
congregation go to their places.*

### ***The Eucharistic Prayer***

The Lord be with you  
**And also with you.**

Lift up your hearts.  
**We lift them to the Lord.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord  
our God.  
**It is right to give thanks and  
praise.**

It is indeed right,  
it is our duty and our joy,  
at all times and in all places  
to give you thanks and praise,  
holy Father, heavenly King,  
almighty and eternal God,  
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

And now we give you thanks  
because, having loved his own  
who were in the world,  
he loved them to the end;  
and on the night before he  
suffered,  
sitting at table with his disciples,  
he instituted these holy  
mysteries,  
that we, redeemed by his death  
and restored to life by his  
resurrection,  
might be partakers of his divine  
nature.

Therefore with angels and  
archangels,  
and with all the company of  
heaven,  
we proclaim your great and  
glorious name,  
for ever praising you and *singing*:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord,  
God of power and might,  
heaven and earth are full of  
your glory.  
Hosanna in the highest.  
Blessed is he who comes in  
the name of the Lord.  
Hosanna in the highest.**

All glory be to you, our heavenly  
Father,

who, in your tender mercy.  
gave your only Son our Saviour  
Jesus Christ  
to suffer death upon the cross for  
our redemption;  
who made there by his one  
oblation of himself once offered  
a full, perfect and sufficient  
sacrifice, oblation and  
satisfaction  
for the sins of the whole world;  
he instituted, and in his holy  
gospel commanded us to  
continue,  
a perpetual memory of his  
precious death until he comes  
again.

Hear us, merciful Father, we  
humbly pray,  
and grant that, by the power of  
your Holy Spirit,  
we receiving these gifts of your  
creation, this bread and this  
wine,  
according to your Son our  
Saviour Jesus Christ's holy  
institution,  
in remembrance of his death and  
passion,  
may be partakers of his most  
blessed body and blood;

who, in the same night that he  
was betrayed,  
took bread and gave you thanks;  
he broke it and gave it to his  
disciples, saying:  
Take, eat; this is my body which  
is given for you;  
do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper  
he took the cup and gave you  
thanks;  
he gave it to them, saying:  
Drink this, all of you;  
this is my blood of the new  
covenant,  
which is shed for you and for  
many for the forgiveness of sins.  
do this, as often as you drink it,  
in remembrance of me.

Jesus Christ is Lord:  
**Lord, by your cross and  
resurrection  
you have set us free.  
You are the Saviour of the  
world.**

Therefore, Lord and heavenly  
Father,  
in remembrance of the precious  
death and passion,  
the mighty resurrection and  
glorious ascension  
of your dear Son Jesus Christ,  
we offer you through him this our  
sacrifice of praise  
and thanksgiving.  
Grant that by his merits and  
death,  
and through faith in his blood,  
we and all your Church may  
receive forgiveness of our sins  
and all other benefits of his  
passion.  
Although we are unworthy,  
through our manifold sins,  
to offer you any sacrifice,  
yet we pray that you will accept  
this

the duty and service that we owe.  
Do not weigh our merits, but pardon our offences, and fill us all who share in this holy communion with your grace and heavenly blessing;  
through Jesus Christ our Lord, by whom, and with whom, and in whom,  
in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.  
**Amen**

*Please sit or kneel.*

### ***The Lord's Prayer***



**Our Father in heaven,  
hallowed be your name,  
your kingdom come,  
your will be done,  
on earth as in heaven.  
Give us today our daily bread.  
Forgive us our sins  
as we forgive those who sin  
against us.  
Lead us not into temptation  
but deliver us from evil.  
For the kingdom, the power,  
and the glory are yours  
now and for ever. Amen.**

### **Breaking of the Bread**

*The president breaks the bread, just as Jesus' body was broken for us.*

Every time we eat this bread

and drink this cup,  
**we proclaim the Lord's death  
until he comes.**

*All sing:*

**Jesus, Jesus, Jesus is the  
Lord,  
Jesus is the Lord God  
almighty.  
Jesus, Jesus, Jesus is the  
Lord,  
Jesus is the Lord God  
almighty.  
Who was, and is, and is to  
come;  
Jesus, Jesus, Jesus is the  
Lord.**

### ***Giving of Communion***

Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

**Lord, I am not worthy to  
receive you,  
but only say the word, and I  
shall be healed.**

### ***The Sharing of the Bread and Cup***

## **Communion Song and Anthem**

give us the mind to follow you  
and to proclaim you as Lord and

may we who share this  
banquet  
glory in the cross of our Lord  
Jesus Christ,  
our salvation, life and hope,  
who reigns as Lord now and  
for ever.  
Amen.**

*All stand.*
