Thought for today

Perhaps the gist of the message in this morning's gospel reading is that we should not allow our baggage, whether mental or physical, get in the way of our mission.

In the culture of the Middle East of two thousand years ago, it was generally accepted that food and shelter would be provided to any traveller, even a stranger. It would be easy for us to assume that anyone who provided in such a way for the disciples, would be considered worthy.

However, Jesus as he often did, had higher standards. Even a home that offered hospitality, maybe even love and care could be considered unworthy if they did not accept the message of the disciples.

So, here is a question for all of us.

Is receiving and sharing the message of the gospel as important as performing good deeds, for example providing food and shelter to a stranger?

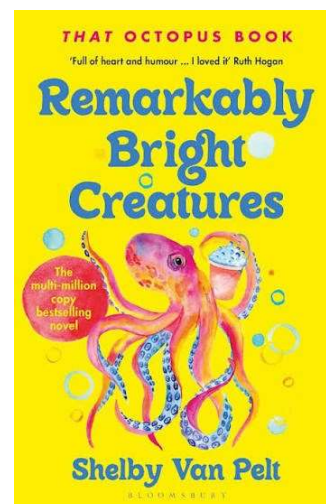

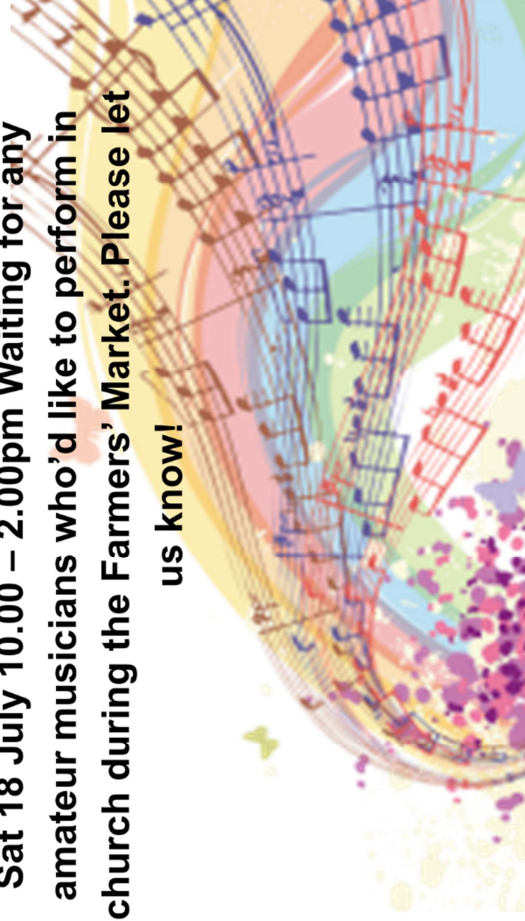
